Dr. Mark Rapoport is an associate professor in the department of psychiatry at the University of Toronto, in the geriatric psychiatry division, a clinical scientist at Sunnybrook Health Sciences Centre, and the current President of the Canadian Academy of Geriatric Psychiatry (CAGP). He is also a member of the Canadian Driving Research Initiative for Vehicular Safety in the Elderly (CanDRIVE), and an associate editor of the Canadian Journal of Geriatrics. He has been on the board of CAGP since 2006, co-chairing the annual CAGP scientific meetings since 2008. He founded the CAGP National Review Course in Geriatric Psychiatry in 2012, an annual event that won the 2014 Joint CPA-COPCE Award for the Most Outstanding Continuing Education Activity in Psychiatry in Canada (academic). He was the scientific co-chair for the 2009 International Psychogeriatric Association Congress in Montreal, Quebec. He is a Fellow of the Canadian Psychiatric Association (CPA), and won the 2014 CAGP Award for Outstanding Contributions in Geriatric Psychiatry. His main areas of research are traumatic brain injury in the elderly and the risk of motor vehicle conditions associated with neurological and psychiatric diseases and their treatments, and he has received research funding from CIHR, Canadian Consortium on Neurodegeneration and Aging, and other peer-reviewed funding agencies. Dr. Rapoport received his medical degree from McMaster University in 1995, and subsequently trained in psychiatry at the University of Toronto, where he works as a geriatric neuropsychiatrist.
