Geriatric Psychiatrist

The Royal Ottawa Health Care Group (ROHCG), a fully affiliated teaching site for the University of Ottawa, is seeking a full-time Geriatric psychiatrist. This academic center provides clinical service, teaching and research opportunities.

The Royal Ottawa Mental Health Center is seeking to recruit a full-time Geriatric Psychiatrist to support clinical care in our specialized inpatient care unit. The inpatient service provides inter-professional assessment and care for patients over the age of 65 with psychiatric illness complicated by medical and/or cognitive challenges. This dynamic team oriented approach to care involves an array of allied health staff, including family medicine specialists, nursing, social work, occupational therapy, physiotherapy, behavioural therapy, recreational therapy, spiritual supports, pharmacy specialists, and nutritionists. The extended care environment in the program includes a robust interventional psychiatry service, extensive ambulatory care program and urban/rural outreach supports for post-discharge care in the community. The program has strong connections with acute care psychiatric services and geriatric medicine programs in the region to support care in multiple settings. As an academic health services centre affiliated with the University of Ottawa, there are ample opportunities for contribution to medical education, research, scholarship and innovation.

In addition to providing service on the inpatient Geriatric Psychiatry service, applicants would have the opportunity to diversify their practice with access to interventional psychiatry (ECT, rTMS, Esketamine), outpatient and day hospital care, outreach to LTC homes, and shared-care outreach to local and remote rural communities. On-call activities are reasonable, with an excellent community of colleagues and resident supports.

- Demonstrated medical/clinical leadership skills, a completed working knowledge of psychopharmacology and experience in mental health service delivery to a broadbased individual and multi-cultural patient population
- Effective verbal and written communication skills.
- Bilingualism preferred.
